## **Horseshoe Contest**

The horseshoe pitching contest for the state started this morning with four teams entered, the Madison team, Redding and Halvorson, and the team composed of Erickson of Beresford and Ellertson of Madison won both their matches. Several more teams are expected to enter tomorrow morning, late trains preventing them from reaching here in time for the matches today.

The individual contests will be started Thursday, it being expected that there will be many entries for these events.

## **Horseshoe Pitching Contest**

The doubles in the state horseshoe pitching contest were finished this morning. E. Ellertson of Madison and C. Erickson of Beresford winning the doubles with a total score of 258 against their opponents, which gives them the cash prize of \$25.00. The other winners were as follows.

Second, G. W. Lawrence and T. H. Darmer, Mt. Vernon, score 204, \$20.00 prize. Third, T. Halverson and J. Redding, Madison, score 196, prize \$15.00.

Fourth, G. White, Huron, and M. Matteson, Virgil, score 187, score \$10.00.

Fifth, W. H. Krishman, Sioux Falls, and C. H. Fridley, Mt. Vernon, score 174, prize \$8.00 Sixth, C. H. Melcrist, Huron, and Andrew Johnson, Big Springs, score 171, prize \$7.00 The singles with 12 entries, including all those who played in the doubles, will be started tomorrow and probably finished in the afternoon.

## **Horseshoe Pitching**

C. Erickson of Beresford won the singles in the first annual horseshoe contest making 223 points out of a possible 225. His record being eight perfect scores and but two points off on one. E. Ellertson of Madison took second place with a score of 197. These two men won the doubles yesterday. The other prize winners and the positions in which they placed were: third, J. Redding, Madison, 190. Fourth, A. Johnson, Big Springs, 186. Fifth, T. Halverson, Madison, 179. Seventh, W. H. Kirschmann, Sioux Falls, 166. Eighth, G. W. Lawrence, Mt. Vernon, 160. Ninth, C. H. Melchert, Huron, 142. Tenth, T. H. Darmer, Mt. Vernon, 110. This was the first state tournament ever held in the state, and J. A. Jensen of Sioux Falls, who was in charge of this feature of the program, is confident that next year will see many more entries and a much greater interest being taken in this sport.
