## **Drey Honored By Horseshoe Body**

**State Association Elects Local Man President. Give Him Cup.**

Ferd Drey, Beresford's veteran horseshoe pitcher was doubly honored at the state tournament held at Brookings in connection with Farm and Home day, by being elected president of the South Dakota Horse Shoe Pitchers association for the coming year and by being presented with a beautiful silver loving cup from the 50 members of that group.

Mr Drey did not compete in the state tournament this year which was won by Leigh Dunker of Warner, but with Will Christenson, last year's state champion and August Nelson he drove to Brookings to watch the others play.

At the conclusion of the tournament he was elected to the presidency of the association. But the assembled pitchers brought out a big surprise package when they presented him with a loving cup in honor of his winning the national championship title for men over 70 years of age in a tournament at Spencer, Iowa three years ago. The cup was also given him in honor of his best he has shown in recent sportsmanship and for the inter-years in the sport.

Mr. Drey, who is 73 years old, still pitches with the best of them and is looking forward to taking part in several tournaments this summer and fall.
