action. Meeting was the adjourned.

GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING, SEPT. 2, 1989 ELK CREEK STEAK HOUSE The meeting was called to order by president Thurmon McKinney. Read minutes of business and officers meeting. Motion to approve by Clair Harris and second by Monte Herreman. Motion was approved. Read Treasurers report. Motion to approve by Clair Harris and second by Monte Herreman. Motion was appoved. Kent Robinson gave presentation on why they would like to hold the 1990 state tournament in Belle Fourche and extended an invitaion to the state. He alson stated that they would offer some type of incentive to all east river players in an effort to help get the complete state back together. Delores Drafahl then extended an invitation to the state to hold the 1990 state tournament in Custer and explained that the city would do everything they could to get the courts in shape for the tournament. Thurmon then called for a vote and it was decided by a 22 to 6 margin to hold the 1990 state tournament in Belle Fourche. At this time Thurmon, conveyed to the body the topics that were discussed in the NHPA state officers meeting and the National convention. Thurmon reappointed all state directors with the exception of Lois Bolstad, leaving that position open until Jan:1, 1990 in the hope of finding someone else. Roland Kleinschmidt suggested changing the date of the state tournament so that players could attend the east river tournament as well. If was explained that all changes in the constitution must be submitted to the state secretary by July 1st of that year. The only offer to run for state Secretary in 1990 was received by Clifford Ziehl. Wayne Pool made motion to hold 1991 state tournament in Custer, provided they get courts in shape. Second by Ed Gebhart. After discussion the motion was withdrawn. Thurmon made Hall of Fame presentation to Liz & Clint Bryson. Motion to adjourn by Wayne Pool. Second by Carlene Donnelly. Meeting adjourned.
